There are other Mason teal, more stylish and more costly, but these were found handsomely wrapped, under the Christmas tree and the card read, "All my love, Maureen". This was quite some time back when I was just beginning to get the fever and what a beautiful sight they were.

Utah is not known as a fertile field for decoy collectors. Several leads concerning those who "might" have made decoys had all expired without results. That some blocks had been fashioned and used, there is no doubt. However, time has dealt them the same fate as the once

abundant passenger pigeon, and also the less plentiful Labrador duck. They are extinct.

Catalog decoys from various mail order houses constituted the bulk of the lures used up and down the central valley of the state. And lo, somehow, a pair of Masons had played out the years where they gathered dust in the basement of an elderly widow's home just three miles away. As the story goes, there were five in all — three drakes and two hens. A local plumber was called to the widow's home to cure an ailing pipe and as he groped a dark corner of the cellar he stirred up a parcel of wooden teal.

Luck would have it that the plumber's wife was an antique fancier, and so, after the work was finished the plumber left the house with five wooden ducks for his pay and the widow was happy that

her pocketbook had not been strained by the incident.

One drake found its way to the mantel of a dear friend of the plumber's wife — where it still sits quietly, but unobtainable less than a mile away. A pair graces a corner shelf in the plumber's home and numerous attempts and offers have failed to dislodge them. The remaining pair, thanks to a resourceful wife bears a place of honor in the Cheever recreation room which has slowly been transformed into the home and office of North American DECOYS.

If there is a moral in my choice it would have to be this — people, more than things, make the difference. Not particularly what, but how, seems of most importance when this collector ponders that ominous question — which one would it be "In Case of Fire".

The 1973 Championship Wildfowl Carving Competition is now history. Held at the Civic Center, Salisbury, Maryland, on April 28th and 29th, the contest was a tremendous success. A total of 206 carvers participated with a record number of entries totaling 916 in all — 201 more than a year ago.

A breakdown of the contestants indicated a healthy interest in all catagories. There were 79 professionals, 70 amateurs and 57 novice carvers represented. Entries were as follows: 349 professional, 359 amateur and 189 novice.

Knute Bartrug, Chairman, and his energetic and dedated committee are to be congratulated on a job well done, and we also extend congratulations and appreciation to a long list of carvers, many of whose names appear in the following list of winners.
